

### **How do I get in to the rubble site?**

You must have your own access number to get access to the rubble site. You can get one at City Hall during business hours of Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. When you get your number, you must enter it on the keypay followed by the # key. The key pad is very sensitive. Use your index finger instead of your thumb when entering the code.

### **Why so many restrictions?**

People ask why they can't dump insulation, shingles, construction material, plastic, painted lumber, etc. The reason is because the city has a rubble site permit with the State of South Dakota. If there is a violation of this permit, the city could lose its license and the state could shut down the rubble site. It's important that we all do our part so we can keep the rubble site open for the community. If you dump material that is not allowed, you could be fined \$200.

### **What's with the cameras?**

Instead of hiring someone to monitor the rubble site, the city has installed cameras to assist in monitoring. This will help keep the expenses down and also keep your fees as low as possible. The camera will capture a picture of your vehicle and license plate number. There are also cameras at the rubble site. If you have not paid when you dump, please stop in at city hall to pay. You must prepay in order to get an access number.

### **If I can't dump it here, then where?**

The Brown County Landfill is your next best bet. They are open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Saturday, 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. The landfill is located west of Aberdeen.

If you have a truck or trailer load of branches, please take them to the back and dump as close to the rest of trees as possible so we do not leave large gaps.


Metal

We do accept metal, but please be aware that many appliances today are not made of metal, but rather plastic. We cannot accept plastic. If you are leaving an appliance, make sure the freon has been taken care of and make sure the technician who took out the freon puts a tag on the unit.

## Where do I put it?

Grass  
Leaves  
Garden Material

You must empty and take your bags back with you or put the bags in the garbage can which is located to the east of the grass area. Do not leave pots, artificial flowers, pop bottles or cans, etc, as they are not part of the composite. When dumping your material, please back up as far as possible to help eliminate gaps between the piles.



### About rummaging at the rubble site

4-1-13 City Restricted Solid Waste Site

F. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or business to do any of the following at the city's restricted solid waste site:

4. Retrieve, take away or remove any rubble without written permission from the city.
